Local Missions ~ We're All in This Together * Hospital Support *

As you know, as part of the Mission Study process, the Mission Study Team hosted focus group discussions to open conversations that began with the survey, and then went deeper into 'what are our dreams for FPC Ukiah'.



One common theme that came out of these focus groups was that we have a heart for local missions – we want to do more in our own country, and even closer to home – in our own community. Did you know that the USA is one of the largest mission fields in the world? Other countries are sending missionaries here! Another common theme is that we desire an inter-generational church community. So, how can all of us, at any age, be part of this "God-sized" ministry??

A group of people in our church family (Denise Beckler, Gayle DeVries, Chris Gordon, Barbara McLean, Wilma Pribyl, Katherine Schoen, Ron Tysseling – with support from Randy Huffman, Missions Elder), have teamed up and begun brainstorming, praying, listening for God's guidance, and feel that God is calling us to reach out to the people in our community who have been hardest hit by the COVID pandemic – our healthcare workers! Behind every Doctor and Nurse is a group of support people who are under just as much stress, feel under-appreciated and have very low morale. They are understaffed, some have reached out to their faith communities unsuccessfully, and for some stress has resulted in in-fighting and ridicule among themselves.

Our church recently finished a study that taught us how to listen to God, discern where He is working, and to join Him in His work. We know these faithful people in the healthcare community are in desperate need of love and support and need to know how much God loves and provides for them. So, for these reasons, we have chosen this un-named group of people to show God's love in a simple but 'God-sized' way.

How will we do this and how can "I" plug in?

- 1. We are asking people of all ages in our church family to create hand-made cards. Contact person is Chris Gordon.
 - a. First step is to CREATE THE CARDS. Do you have a Cri-cut? Enjoy card-making? We're looking for small, single fold, half sheet sized cards that are simply decorated and <u>blank inside</u>. There will be a card-making party on Thursday, Sept. 30 at 10:30. Anyone is invited to come participate bring whatever you like to create cards with. Or, just come and learn how to make a card! We're also willing to host a card-making party on an evening. Call Chris Gordon if you are interested in that. Please have your hand-created cards back to the church by Sunday, October 10th.
 - b. Beginning October 10th, we will offer the *blank-inside* cards to all of you to pick up a few and put your own hand-written message inside, draw a picture, or simply write Thank You God Loves You! Please be sure to sign it, too. This is a great opportunity for people of all ages! We would like to have all finished cards back by Sunday, October 24th.

2. MAKE COOKIES. Contact person is Gayle DeVries.

We would like as many people as possible to make cookies... as many as you can. We want all kinds, including some gluten-free and nut-free. Would you like to host a cookie-baking party? How fun it is to bake together! Are you interested in a baking partner? Contact Gayle – she will hook you up with someone. Please have your baked cookies to the church by Sunday, October 31st.

3. Week of October 31st PACKAGE IT ALL UP. Contact person is Jaunita Coddington.

We want to have everything packaged in safe, hand-made packages. Each package will have a hand-made card, a few cookies, and a gift card from one of our local coffee businesses. (*Thank you Wilma for gathering up the gift cards!*)

DEADLINE SCHEDULE:

October 10th: Bring 'created' cards to the church (decorated on the front, blank inside)

Pick up blank-inside cards to sign, write message, decorate inside.

October 24th: Bring your 'signed' cards to the church.

Begin making cookies – as many as you want to make – we'll take them all!

October 31st: Bring your cookies to the church.

Week of October 31st: We'll package it all up to be ready for delivery to the hospital. We will have more information on this task soon. Stay tuned!

Will you join in this God-sized inter-generational ministry alongside us? The great thing about this project is that there are many steps... many opportunities for you to 'plug in' somewhere! We know this is God's ministry and not our own, so for that reason we are not putting any limitations on it in terms of numbers of cards, numbers of cookies, number of packages. THIS IS IN GOD'S HANDS. He knows the needs and He will provide. Let's see what God can do with our hands and feet!

Dear Congregation, (Sent by mail to the congregation 9/28/2021)

We, your session, want to communicate to you the status of our church finances in a clear, transparent way. After August finances were finalized, reports were reviewed by the finance committee. The committee provided reports to session at the September session meeting. The attached letter from the finance committee will appear in the October Presbeat. It clearly states our current financial position and the estimate for the rest of the year.

We are mailing this letter out along with a copy of the finance committee's Presbeat article to provide you this information as soon as possible so that you will have time to consider the information and if you have questions. We will be having a congregation conversation on finances **AND** the completed Mission Study on Sunday, October 10th right after service. In order to keep our meeting to a reasonable time, the plan is to devote 20 minutes to our finances and 20 minutes to the Mission Study.

Our current study in Mark includes the following passage: Mark 12:29-31 "The most important one," replied Jesus, "is this: Hear, O Israel, the Lord our God, the Lord is one. Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength. The second is this: Love your neighbor as yourself. There is no commandment greater than these."

As a church, we desire to love God with our whole being and love our neighbor as ourselves. This desire is reflected in the way we live, give and serve. We have experienced some unexpected challenges, but know God is faithful as we continue to serve Him. Please pray on how God is inviting us, His church, into what God is already doing and how He is inviting each of us to financially support the ministries of our church. November is our traditional stewardship time. Session has started on budget planning for 2022. Please pray for our church as we discern God's will for us.

Dear Congregation,

Our church has gone through a significant transition these last couple of years. We experienced COVID which ultimately impacted our ability to fully meet as a church family. We had a solo pastor step down which put us in a season of transition. Through all of this, God has remained faithful to First Presbyterian Church of Ukiah and has provided for us in unexpected ways. Yet, these events have impacted our finances for 2021.

The financial format below is like what we have been sharing with the congregation for a couple months, with one exception. This format is presenting an estimated full year (through December) view for 2021, versus just

showing year-to-date activity. Now that Pastor Tony has begun serving in our church, we have a clearer picture of our expenses for September-December.

The budget for 2021 that was approved by Session had a gap between income vs. expenses of (\$31,508). As we reported last month, we had incurred a gap of (\$37,172) through July. August giving and expenses were in line with our budgeted amounts. Our full year estimate is that we will be short (\$60,000) – meaning our expenses will be more than our income by this amount. The reason for the increase from the budgeted loss vs. our projected loss is shown here:

Our church has been blessed with a generous congregation. We are grateful that our church family's faithful giving has sustained us through the last couple of challenging years. While we do have cash reserves to cover this shortfall, using these reserves will not allow us to use them for missional opportunities. We are asking you to prayerfully consider increasing your giving to help cover this shortfall and bridge the gap for 2021. Together, and with God's help we will be able to continue serving others both locally and globally.
