Beloved in Christ:



On Friday, October 15th, I went downtown to view those massive pumpkins at the Pumpkin Fest. (I believe the largest weighed 406 lbs!) What an event that was! It was like a carnival! Well done, Ukiah!

As I passed the amazing mural on the wall of the Community Center in Church Street, some words in the upper right-hand corner caught my eye: *"Our Future Together".*

I thought immediately of First Presbyterian Church, Ukiah, and of how those words could be a fitting slogan (perhaps for our upcoming Stewardship Drive?) as *together* we strive to build a working model of God's Kingdom in this place.

Jesus made it clear that teamwork was crucial in the promotion of His

message. And whenever His disciples tended to "go it alone", or elevate themselves above the "team" -- as the brothers James and John tried to do in Mark 10:35-45, or as Judas did, with tragic results (Matthew 27:3-5) -- He would try to bring them back to heel and remind them of their responsibilities to God -- and to the collective body, the "team".

During my short time with you, my sense is that First Presbyterian is a strong, vibrant fellowship -- a "team" -- with a long and noble history, ready to move into the future for Jesus, Who leads the way. The search for a new installed Pastor requires a process that will take time, effort and patience. However, the process is well under way, and this parish has been through the process before -- so nothing should be too strange or unusual. The congregation is well ahead of the curve in terms of the Mission Study having been completed, and the Nominating Committee is making good progress towards presenting a slate of nominees to the congregation, who will ultimately elect and establish a Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) in accordance with the formula prescribed by the Church Leadership Connection of the Presbyterian Church (USA). In this edition of *Presbeat* you will find a page entitled *The Call Process* which clearly outlines the steps necessary before a formal Call is presented to a prospective new installed Pastor. Please feel free to ask me or any elder should you have questions about the process.

With respect to Covid-19 : You might have noticed in the media that Mendocino County is not yet "out of the woods" with respect to the pandemic ... in fact numbers are up compared with the same period last year. I'd like to thank you all for being so compliant regarding the medical science and legal protocols. Also in this *Presbeat* you'll find contact details -- should you need them -- for information about Covid-19 vaccines, testing, and masking.

Finally, please accept my heartfelt thanks for your many good wishes, cards, e-mails and other kind expressions on the occasion of my 80th birthday on Sunday, October 24. (I'm staggered as I write those digits!) Please know that your sentiments are very deeply appreciated. Thank you all so much.

Operation Christmas Child 2021



First Presbyterian will only collect boxes from our congregation.

New Life Community Church ("Burger King Church") is the central drop location for Humboldt, Lake and Mendocino Counties, meaning they will have a semi-trailer to load the cartons in (similar to Santa Rosa) to go to the Southern California processing center. They will collect boxes from three counties, churches and individuals. New Life has the facility/parking lot to accommodate the shoeboxes and the semi-trailer. Praise God!

FINANCE UPDATE:

Dear Congregation,

Thank you for participating in our congregational conversation on Sunday October 10th to review our finances. It is important for us to be as transparent as possible with the status of our budget for 2021. We all are aware that these last 18+ months have been challenging for our families, our communities, and our church. However, during this time God has remained faithful to each of us and to First Presbyterian Church of Ukiah.

As we reviewed together, we are projecting a full year shortfall of income vs. expenses of \$(62,079). Our payments related to the departure of Pastor David have been completed, as have the expenses of bringing Pastor Tony to Ukiah. Now that we are "back to normal" as far as staffing goes, we believe it is important to focus on our remaining 3 months of 2021. Our projection of income and expenses for this period is listed below.

Both Session and the Finance Committee are working to spend only what is necessary during this time and hopefully our actual expenses will be less than our projected expenses for the remainder of this year. This December the expenses are more than most months because it has 3 payrolls. Payroll is paid every other week, thus two months a year contain 3 payroll periods.

Our church has always been blessed with a generous congregation. We are grateful that our church family's faithful giving has sustained us through the years, and we have faith that this will continue. While we do have cash reserves to cover this shortfall, using these reserves will not allow us to use them for missional opportunities. We ask that you pray for our church and our finances and prayerfully consider what you can do to help bridge this gap for these final months of the year. Together, and with God's help we will be able to continue serving others both locally and globally. If you have any questions, please reach out to one of us on the Finance Committee. Dear Members and Friends of First Presbyterian Church of Ukiah,

God is our provider and we have been blessed by Him for many years. In the Proverbs passage above, we are reminded that God promised to provide for us when we honor Him. During the pandemic in 2020, we were concerned that we would need to use our savings to cover expenses, yet by the end of last year our church gave above and beyond and no savings was needed. We have witnessed God providing for each of us and our church even during the Covid pandemic. We are thankful for you and for your faithful and generous giving in time, talent, and treasure. This year has brought its own challenges; and although we are anticipating the need to use some of our savings to cover our expenses for the first time, we are trusting God to provide and the faithful stewardship of our resources.

Our tithes and offerings have allowed us to engage in ministry in different ways this last year. We have been able to continue financially supporting missions locally and globally, such financial support to Pastor John and the orphanage in Uganda to build a piggery and support Kayla in a short-term mission trip this past year. We have been live-streaming our Sunday worship service and were able to open our sanctuary again for in-person services. Children and youth outreach have adapted to the Covid restrictions. The youth group has been meeting regularly and throughout the summer. One of our students, Viviana will be representing the Redwood Presbytery at the General Assembly in 2022. Efforts to reopen Sunday School in a safe manner are underway. Our Trunk or Treat hosted 945 guests from our community with lines to get in extending down the street.

When we give our tithes and offerings we partner with God and with each other in ministry. Our Pledge Cards is our written commitment to answer "yes" to God's invitation. This next year brings many possibilities as we look forward to calling our next lead pastor, serve globally and locally, and extend care to one another and to our youth and children. Please use the enclosed Pledge Card to record your commitment for 2022. Our Pledge Card Dedication Sunday will be November 21st. Please bring your pledge card with you to this worship service or you may return it to the church office.

This year we will celebrate what God has done in us and through us with our Harvest Feast, which will be a pickup Lasagna Dinner that same Sunday. Registrations for the meal will be available next week. Look for Sunday announcements and emails with registration link.
