Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

Some have recently been asking about the possibility of resuming worship inside the sanctuary. The leaders of the church are longing to resume worship inside, just as you are. We are praying with you that the day will come quickly when we can worship together inside the sanctuary. Unfortunately, that day has not yet arrived.

The session had decided that we will return to indoor worship just as soon as the government allows us to do so. According to the Mendocino County November 17, 2020 Purple Tier Shelter-In-Place Health Order, we are still allowed to gather outside for worship. We are also allowed to have a small group in the sanctuary for the purpose of live-streaming the service so that people can worship at home.

As you are aware, this health order was put in place to protect us from the spread of COVID-19. By the grace of God, no one has contracted COVID-19 at our church.

There are some churches in our county that have decided to disobey the government and worship inside. They have made their decision prayerfully and after considering Scriptures, such as Acts 5:29,

Peter and the other apostles replied: "We must obey God rather than human beings!

We have also prayerfully considered Scriptures, such as Romans 13:1-2,

Let everyone be subject to the governing authorities, for there is no authority except that which God has established. The authorities that exist have been established by God.

Consequently, whoever rebels against the authority is rebelling against what God has instituted, and those who do so will bring judgment on themselves.

There will be times when faithful followers of Christ will disagree on how the Scriptures speak to the issues of the day. We deeply respect those with whom we disagree. During times of disagreement, we are all committed to following Ephesians 4:3,

Make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace.

Please continue to pray for our swift return to indoor worship. And please continue to pray for our health care workers, leaders, and for those who are struggling and grieving because of COVID-19.
