Friends,

The journey to finding new pastoral leadership can feel daunting. But it also can be exciting, for this is a process of discernment - listening closely and carefully for the will of God regarding the mission and ministry of your congregation.

Your Session will be forming an **Interim Pastor Search Committee**. An Interim (or Transitional) Pastor leads a congregation during the transition time after an installed pastor has departed and before the next installed pastor is called. Often, the Interim Pastor assumes the same responsibilities

as the outgoing pastor (worship leadership, pastoral care, Session moderator, supervision of staff) as well as assisting with the congregational mission study and helping the congregation prepare for its next leader. Interim Pastors will help the Session provide for continuity of essential programs and may assist the Session in assessing needs for change. The Interim Pastor Search Committee conducts the search, interviews candidates, and then presents the final candidate for the position to the Session. An interim pastor is hired under a contract with the Session.

The Interim Pastor often will assist with the **Mission Study** process. The Mission Study is an opportunity for your congregation to analyze and assess your ministry and discern where God is calling you to go in the future. A well-founded Mission Study includes fact-finding about the congregation and the community in which it ministers. It provides an opportunity for you, as members of the congregation, to prayerfully study what scripture says about the church, to learn new information about the community of Ukiah and its needs, to learn who you have been in the past, who you are now, and who you want to be in the future as a congregation, and to celebrate your gifts as well as recognize challenge areas. Typically, a Mission Study report includes a financial review, a summary of demographics (of your congregation as well as the community of Ukiah), and mission/vision statements in order to provide an objective and representational summary of who you are. Alan Adams, former Executive Presbyter of Washington Presbytery explains the value of a Mission Study: "It boils down to a church looking out the window (what's our mission field?) and in the mirror (who are we and what gifts has God given us for this time and place?)."

In the PC(USA) call process, the congregation gives authority to search for a pastor to a **Pastor Nominating Committee** (PNC). Once the PNC is elected, the other members of the congregation and the session have no role in determining who will be the next pastor until the PNC is ready to present its nominee to the congregation for a vote. Once the Mission Study report has been approved by Session and shared with the congregation, your Pastor Nominating Committee will be elected by the congregation to begin that discernment process. In addition, a Presbytery liaison from the Committee on Ministry will be

appointed to serve alongside your PNC members. More details about the PNC process will be shared as that time comes closer.

Friends, it is vital at all times, but especially in times of transition and change to know that God is present with you – He is the one great unchanging constant in life.

First Presbyterian Church of Ukiah (FPCU) Prayer Ministry Policy

Our Purpose: To provide for an avenue for church family members and friends of the congregation to request for prayer, either confidentially or publicly.

Our Goal is to use our prayer ministry in a God-honoring way, and to share Christ's love to all those with prayer concerns.

Psalm 121: 1-2 "I lift my eyes up to the mountains. Where does my help come from? My help comes from the Lord, the Maker of heaven and earth."

Statement of Policy:

The Prayer Ministry is an effective and accessible way for friends and members of our church family to share their prayer concerns. There are two (2) different prayer groups through which prayer may be requested:

- Confidential Prayer: Sometimes a person may want prayer, but does not wish their concern to be shared publicly or printed in the bulletin. The Confidential Prayer group includes the Pastoral Staff (Pastors and Office Manager) and Ruling Elders.

 James 5:14 "Is anyone among you sick? Let them call the elders of the church to pray over them and anoint them with oil in the name of the Lord.
- **E-Prayer:** Prayer concerns that are not confidential will be shared as an e-prayer. The e-prayer group includes the Pastoral Staff, Ruling Elders, members of the congregation, regular attenders, and friends of the congregation. *Philippians 4:6 "Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God."*

Prayer requests will be shared via email and not by phone. It is understood that e-prayer is not a "prayer chain". Prayer requests are not intended to be passed along to others. The prayer ministry is simply an invitation for those members to join in the ministry of prayer – to uphold each other when in need of healing, for prayers of praise, or other prayer concerns.

Submitting Requests:

1. Prayer requests are given to the Prayer Ministry Coordinator. The Coordinator will help to determine with which group to share the prayer concern, whether it's confidential or e-prayer.

- 2. If the requestor is asking prayer for someone else, permission must be granted by that second person. The second person should also determine from which group s/he wants to request prayer.
- 3. The Coordinator will include in the prayer request email the name of the requestor, the person for whom the prayer is for (if not for themselves), and specific details of the request. Each request will also include scripture and a reminder that e-prayer is not a "prayer chain", but simply an invitation to join in the ministry of prayer.
- 4. Requestors should follow up with the Coordinator with periodic updates when possible.
- 5. Requests for prayer may also be submitted by completing the request form in the Sanctuary Registration Pads and dropped in the offering plate. These will be given directly to the Pastor(s), who may make the determination to share with the Confidential group.
- 6. It is required that all participating in the Prayer Ministry will review and reconfirm participation on an annual basis.
