Check the nutrition label for ingredients prior to purchasing vitamins. (Hint: Costco carries "Smartypants"... those are great!)
- Beans: It's preferable to not donate in "bulk". A 20# bag fits perfectly and stays contained upon opening the box.
- Alternatively, you might consider making a monetary donation to Caritas and let us do the purchasing for you.

RECYCLING REVELATIONS

This article will focus on **fluorescent light tubes/bulbs**. When we think of fluorescent tubes, what often comes to mind are the four-foot and eight-foot tubes we see is kitchen lights, hallways, and retail stores. There are also those coiled tubes (compact fluorescent lights or CFL's) we use in place of traditional incandescent bulbs for better energy efficiency.

DISPOSING of these kinds of tubes requires special care because the tubes contain a very small amount of mercury. Mercury is extremely toxic to humans and animals. These glass tubes need to be handled very carefully to avoid being broken and to prevent the spillage of mercury.

DO NOT PUT THESE TUBES IN THE TRASH, EVER!

The Mendocino Solid Waste Management Authority (MSWA) has regularly scheduled days where you can drop off these items, free of charge. https://mendorecycle.org/uploads/a76e79b6-4641-4e16-905e-fba5e3accecb.pdf Recently, our church replaced many of its fluorescent lights with LED type lighting. We now have many CFL bulbs available for your use at home, FREE! Simply let me know how many you need and I will deliver them to you. CFL bulbs use only about 23 watts of power compared to the traditional 100 watt incandescent bulb.



Song Story... "Joyful Joyful We Adore Thee", c1907

The author of this hymn, Henry Jackson van Dyke, was a pastor of the Brick Presbyterian Church in New York City. He later became professor of English literature at Princeton, and author of a number of books, including *"The Other Wise Man"*.

In 1907 Henry van Dyke was invited to preach at Williams College in Massachusetts. At breakfast one morning, he handed the college president a piece of paper, saying, "Here is a hymn for you. Your mountains (the Berkshires) were my inspiration, it must be sung to the music of Beethoven's "*Hymn of Joy*".

When he was later asked about the hymn, van Dyke replied: "These verses are simple expressions of common Christian feelings and desires in this present time – hymns of today that may be sung together by people who know of the thought of the age, and are not afraid that any truth of science will destroy religion, or any revolution on earth overthrow the kingdom of heaven. Therefore this is a hymn of trust and joy and hope.

 150 food boxes will go out this weekend to immigrant communities, all including masks sewn by former refugees who now live in Spokane



- We've given away 15 Educational Care Packages: books, art supplies and outdoor games to help families while their kids are out of school
- Our employment staff has helped 55 immigrants FIND new jobs since the COVID shutdowns began! Isn't that amazing, when unemployment in our country is at its highest?
- Our Immigration and Legal Services staff is providing free consultations for Dreamers, working young adults who arrived in the US as children and for whom there is still no clear path to citizenship
- Immigrant high school graduates are empowered by sharing their stories and their future plans on social media
- We're helping immigrant church congregations find creative, healthy ways to stay connected while social distancing

Beyond the work of the World Relief staff, former refugees are . . .

- Helping one another cope with the pandemic by providing food and friendship to newer arrivals
- Grateful for help with unemployment claims and, in return, giving back financially to help others
- Cooking at a new restaurant concept <u>Feast World Kitchen</u> where immigrant chefs take over the restaurant, one cuisine at a time, to serve up pre-ordered takeout

Please take a few minutes to thank God that even in discouraging times, He still uses us to help our communities to flourish.
