Our church has been reminded again of how God is at work all the time and desires for us to come along side and enter into a deeper relationship with him. While we all have been affected by the sudden departure of our pastor, God was not surprised and had a plan. We found an incredibly gifted man of God to serve as our interim pastor. He is experienced and will be able to connect well to all.

Reverend Anthony "Tony" Gamley was born, raised and educated in South Africa where he currently lives with his wife Beryl. They are the parents of three married adult sons, living in New Zealand, England and Oregon. Pastor Tony has a strong educational background. He holds a Bachelor of Divinity from Rhodes University, a University Teacher's License in Pianoforte and a BA in Musicology from the University of South Africa. He

also holds a Doctor of Ministry from San Francisco

Theological Seminary. Tony has completed three different Interim Training programs and a further "Beyond Conflict" training.

Pastor Tony was ordained as a Minister of Word and Sacraments with the Presbyterian Church of South Africa in 1966 and has been a minister in good standing of the PCUSA since 1973. He became a naturalized US citizen in Hawaii in 2011 while serving there as an interim for three years. Pastor Tony has served as a solo Pastor, Co-Pastor, Head of Staff, College Lecturer, Superintendent of Education of Religious Education programs and Interim Pastor for four separate congregations (Washington State, Oakland CA, Hawaii, and New Zealand).

Pastor Tony's chief passion in ministry is pastoral care. In his own words, he tries to instill "mutual care, understanding and forgiveness, respect and kindness. As Christ loved the church, so the members of the Body are urged to love one another." He maintains an open-door policy with opportunities for confidential one-on-one conversations. Encouraging and participating in home visits to the church family is important to him and he relates well to young people, the aged and the ill. Over his years of ministry, he has developed a deep appreciation of the role of the laity.

The IPNC (Interim Pastor Nominating Committee) have found Pastor Tony to be a caring, understanding, approachable person and a good listener. Tony is a skilled bridge builder and communicator having served in multiple interim settings with high praise from colleagues who knew him. His sermons are thoughtful and scripturally-based. Tony's wide international experience, including his enduring commitment to the anti-apartheid movement in South Africa, has given him the opportunity to have a broad, insightful view of the

strengths and needs of both the world and individual communities; these are reflected in his ministry and mission. In his Statement of Faith, Tony says, "Over the years, passages like Amos 5:24, Micah 6:8, and Luke 4:18,19 have informed my outlook on the equitable treatment of God's children - especially the poor, oppressed and voiceless."

The IPNC and Session are happy to welcome Pastor Tony to First Presbyterian of Ukiah as our Interim Pastor. Please join us in praying for safe and smooth travels for Pastor Tony and a good transition to FPCU.

Dear Church Family,

He got up, rebuked the wind and said to the waves, "Quiet! Be still!"

Then the wind died down and it was completely calm.

He said to his disciples, "Why are you so afraid? Do you still have no faith?"

-Mark 4:39-40

In Mark 4, we find the story of Jesus sailing to the other side of the lake. As Jesus slept in the stern of the boat on a cushion, a furious squall came up. The waves broke over the boat, so that the boat was nearly swamped. The disciples had to wake Jesus up! And they said to him, "Teacher, don't you care if we drown?"

What thoughts must have raced through their minds as they scrambled to save their boats and their lives? What did they think Jesus could do for them? Did their question betray their doubts about God's love for them?

As if to answer all their questions, Jesus got up and rebuked the wind and waves. With his word, "Quiet! Be still!" the chaos that looked as if it would consume the disciples was put to rest. The storm was no more. Then Jesus asks his disciples, "Why are you so afraid? Do you still have no faith?" The disciples had seen Jesus heal the sick and the demon possessed. They had heard him teach with such authority. But they questioned his ability to save them.

Jesus' question for his disciples is true for us today. It is easy to get caught up in the storms of this life. The fear and stress the Covid pandemic is as if a wave is coming over the side of the boat. The hurricanes and earthquakes occurring in Haiti and the United States is another wave that can cause fear. The fires in California causing destruction. The violence and lives lost in the Middle East makes the chaos feel overwhelming. Let alone personal challenges each of us face.

Yet, Jesus showed his disciples that he is the Master of the wind and the waves. He showed his followers that he has authority over the chaos. Jesus, God the Son, also demonstrated his great care and love for us by defeating death itself by dying on a cross and being raised three days later.

What can we face today that Jesus does not already have authority over? With all the events occurring in our lives, I am reminded of Jesus' words in John 16:33, "In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world." Will we trust Jesus to see us through this next storm? Will we have confidence in His saving grace? I want to scream, "YES!" but I know that is only possible with God's help. May we all keep our faith rooted in Jesus Christ and find our peace in him.



Mission Study Team

The Mission Study team has been meeting faithfully for a couple months. We developed a survey which we shared with the congregation and invited everyone to participate. We received 52 responses. Our team reviewed the results, graphed several of the responses and summarized the themes of the essay questions. We used this document for the four focus groups we held, as well as these 3 questions:

- What gifts has God given First Presbyterian Church Ukiah to offer?
- Given these gifts, what opportunities do we have to minister to our community?
- Where is God leading us as a church and what do we do about it?

The focus groups have been well attended - 42 people in total. We have had great discussions as to how we join God in His work in our community and beyond. These focus groups are part of a journey - a journey of discovery and a journey of where God is calling us. The Mission Study Team is now compiling all of this information and is developing a report. This report will help inform what kind of leader to call for our Lead Pastor position. Our final report will be shared with Session, our congregation and Lead Pastor applicants. We are grateful to all of you that have supported the Mission Study Team in discerning God's will for First Presbyterian Church, Ukiah.

Who is the Personnel Committee?

The purpose of the Personnel Committee is to assist the Session in fulfilling its responsibilities for the persons employed by the church and volunteers. Its mission is to nurture and encourage the paid and volunteer staff in the completion of their duties.

The Committee was involved presenting the Senior Pastor's Terms of Call for 2021 in January and then in the administration of the severance agreement in February.

An additional Section of the Employee Handbook on Performance Evaluations was developed by the Committee and approved by Session. Performance Evaluations were presented to the Director of Youth and Family Ministries and the Office Manager/Music Director. Other sections of the Employee Handbook were revised to provide clarity and approved by Session.

A member of the Committee was part of the Interim Pastor Search Committee and the Chair has been involved in negotiations of a contract.
